MINISTRY & CAMPUS INFORMATION

Thank you for your interest in joining in on the groundwork taking place through BBB. Please take the time to carefully read through so that you are fully informed of the expectations and equipped to join us and have a pleasant, successful experience. More than anything, our hope is for every single volunteer that comes through to encounter God in powerful ways. We ask that you come with an open heart and mind and the right intentions to serve and allow God to use you as He sees fit. Because this is a mission trip, we ask that you mindfully prepare yourself spiritually through prayer and fasting before you begin your experience.

INDIVIDUAL/TEAM LEADERS

Teams are expected to have a Team Leader who facilitates and plans specifics ahead of time. Team Leaders are responsible for the ENTIRE team while on the ground.

If you are serving individually, you will be expected to join in with other teams that are present while you serve and participate alongside them.

PERSONAL TRIP COSTS

- Airfare in the U.S. usually ranges anywhere from \$870 to \$1500 depending on the time and season.
- Weekly Food/Water Consumption Fee: \$100 USD (paid upon arrival)
- Transportation, including airport pick up and drop off, as well as Boda rides if necessary. **See Transportation Costs*
- Extra money for restaurant outings, souvenirs, and tourist attractions.

Required Additional Costs

- Requested Materials List (list of food and supplies for groups of 5 people or more)
- UGANDA - VISA fee \$50 (Tourist VISA in Uganda) Must be preapproved online before departure. Complete @ <https://visas.immigration.go.ug>
- RWANDA – VISA fee \$30 (Transit) – received upon arrival @airport, BUT you must still get preapproval visa for Uganda before departure.



IMMUNIZATION

You are encouraged to have the following prior to traveling:

- **Mandatory Vaccine:**
Yellow Fever (you'll have to bring the Yellow Fever Card with you to enter before immigration). **IF** you have an Egg allergy, you can get a notarized Doctor's note instead.
- **Recommended** Vaccines and Meds: Typhoid, Hep A and B, Malaria Medicine

FLIGHTS & VISA

- **PASSPORT:** Make sure your passport is valid and within 6 months of expiring before your travel dates. It's an international law and you will not be allowed to embark.
- Some airlines ask for the credit card used to purchase your flight when you first embark on your trip. Make sure you either bring the credit card with you or call ahead and verify the card you used.
- **VISA ENTRY IN UGANDA:** Must be applied online and approved. Can take up to 2 months to be approved. Apply in time please. <https://visas.immigration.go.ug>

TRANSPORTATION COSTS (AIRPORT)

- ENTEBBE - One way for 1-3 people w/luggage = \$400usd.
- ENTEBBE - One way for 4-9 people w/luggage = \$650usd.
- RWANDA - One way for 1-3 people w/luggage = \$200usd.
- RWANDA - One way for 4-9 people w/luggage = \$350usd.

HOTEL COSTS

- Hotel costs per night can vary from \$50/pp - \$150/pp. Please be prepared for this personal cost if a Hotel stay is needed or wanted before reaching BBB Campus

DAILY SCHEDULE

- 7 AM-7 PM is our time to be outside the home, whether working in activities/projects, going to town, etc. *7PM is the curfew for being outside of campus gates.*
- A typical Monday-Friday starts with breakfast and devotionals at 7:45 AM, with work starting at 9am. There is a short lunch break and teams will usually head back out until about 5-5:30 PM, after which dinner is served at 6-6:30 PM.



- 8 PM-10 PM is Team Time, but it must be quiet after 8 PM as the kids will be sleeping.
- 10PM is night curfew, by which lights are out and every single person is in their room.
- On Sundays, we have fellowship at Calvary Church from 11am-1pm, and then head out to lunch afterwards.

HOUSE RULES

- NO food, shoes, or drinks allowed in Common Areas, Bedrooms, Restrooms, or Showers (except water). Food and drinks are to be consumed in Dining Area or Kitchen.
- 7AM-7PM is our time to be outside the home, whether working in activities/projects, going to town, etc. It's very dark and not safe at other times.
- Electricity is on Solar Panels, so if you're not using an outlet, please turn it off. Please bring a converter/transformer with you as our voltage is 220V.
- Water: our water is turned off a few times a week, so we need to be conscious when it happens and not be too wasteful. We do have solar water heaters, so on sunny days, there will be hot water.
- GIRLS: Please keep your hair in a ponytail or bun around eating areas. Please don't leave loose hair anywhere including bedrooms, bathrooms, and/or showers.
- If you break something, you must pay for it.
- We have SUFFICIENT mosquito and sunblock spray on hand, no need to bring any.

BUNKING & BATHROOMS

Team members will stay on our campus in a mission guest house. Team members will be separated by gender into separate rooms, each with twin bunk beds. You may want to bring earplugs if you are a light sleeper. Bathrooms have cold running water and showers have hot running water (on sunny days as they are heated by the sun), and bedrooms have bedding and pillows. We also have clean towels for everyone. We also have washing machines for Laundry, and a dryer for drying. The lighter clothing, the better for faster drying.

DRESS CODE

WOMEN'S DRESS CODE:

- Skirts that are to the knee or longer
- Loose-fitting pants, loose-fitting capris
- Simple, solid, light weight, breathable shirts
- Long-sleeve shirts and sweaters for colder mornings and nights
- Chest and back must be covered
- Chacos or another durable sandal
- Raincoat/Poncho
- Rainboots or Hiking Boots



MEN'S DRESS CODE:

- Bring comfortable shorts, pants suitable for labor
- Bring simple, solid, light weight, and breathable shirts
- Long-sleeve shirts and sweaters for colder mornings and nights
- At least one pair of pants and a nicer (collared) shirt for church
- Closed toe shoes/work boots
- Raincoat/Poncho
- Rainboots or Hiking Boots

THINGS TO KNOW:

- If you're coming to work with children, you can bring activities, games, etc.
- Working with women, most things can be found here.
- Candy is heavy and can be found here, so no need to bring it from the states.
- Secondhand clothing/shoes can also be found here at the markets. **IF** there is a large team and each one can bring 1-2 free luggage's of 50lbs, fill them up with Donations and bring them as there are people that can benefit greatly.
- There will be things I need here that I may not be able to find or that are too expensive, so there will be luggages already made (*mostly in MICHIGAN*) that I'd like for each person to bring. Minimum one 50lbs luggage, if possible two.
- With all international flights from the states, you're allowed two 50lbs luggage's, one carryon and one smaller bag.
- All money is changed to Ugandan shillings upon arrival to BBB Campus, **by Lily.**
- **Don't ever give money to anyone here. If it's on your heart to help someone specifically, please ask Lily first.**
- **All USD must be new \$100s and new \$50s ONLY, year 2009 and up. No lesser bills can be brought. Uganda will not change old, stained, stamped, written on or torn money.**

TOURISM OPTIONS

QUEEN ELIZABETH NATIONAL PARK

- Taxi to take you there/back = \$350usd/spilt with group
- Entrance per person=\$40usd/person
- Entrance fee for car = \$30usd/split with group
- Guided GAME DRIVE (Savana animals) = \$150usd split between group. **IF** the group is more than 8 people, it doubles the price for an extra guided vehicle.
- Boat Cruise=\$30usd/person
- Hotel in Safari Lodge one night = can vary from \$30/person to \$115/person depending on hotel choice



- Food – varies on what there's available and what you like = \$10-\$15/meal
- Souvenirs – they have them so you can have about \$50usd changed into shillings

KAMPALA-CAPITAL

- \$300- \$550 split with group one way (depending on group size).
- We use boda-boda (motorcycle taxi) around the capital (about \$1 or so every time)
- Hotel – varies but can be anywhere from \$50-\$85/pp
- Food – average meals are about \$15-\$20usd
- Souvenirs

LAKE BUNYONI BOAT RIDE

- \$75usd/split between group
